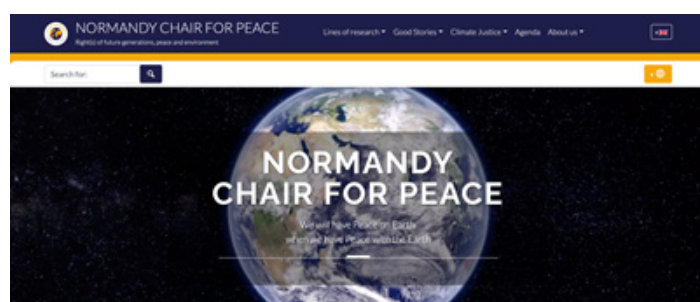

TRANSITIONAL JUSTICE RESEARCH LINE - COLOMBIAN WEBINARS

The Normandy Chair for Peace's Transitional Justice Research Line is focusing its efforts on an initiative that will allow the public to address and deepen two topics: 1. Peace, Environment and the Rights of Nature in the Colombian Post-Agreement and 2. The global rural reform envisaged in the peace process and the territorial rights of indigenous peoples.



Thus, after several meetings of the research team with participants and collaborators such as the Observatory of Territorial Rights of Indigenous Peoples of the Indigenous Technical Secretariat of the National Commission of Indigenous Lands in Colombia. It was agreed that this project will be developed in two sessions to be held in July and August of this year. The format idea for each session will count with an introduction to understand the context of the post-conflict in Colombia and there will be three types of speakers: a national representative, an international and an indigenous one. At the end of each session, there will be a debate among the participants through questions from the audience.

This team is composed by **Laetitia BRANCONNIER**, **Émilie GAILLARD**, **Luis Miguel GUTIERREZ** and **Victor TAFUR**, members of the Normandy Chair for Peace and **July CALDERON**, coordinator of the Observatory of Territorial Rights in Colombia.

INTERGENERATIONAL MEETING

INTERVIEW WITH **HILARIO DAVIDE JR**, FORMER SUPREME COURT JUSTICE OF THE PHILIPPINES



Instead of an indigenous video meeting for this month, and to launch the Good Legal Stories branch (Good Stories research axis), the NCP conducted an interview with **Hilario DAVIDE Jr**, who was the judge in charge of the **OPOSA vs. Factoran** case, which is now a landmark decision in the Philippine and global legal landscape as it is the first time a judge has articulated the rights of future generations. He was also one of the architects of the Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples, adopted by the United Nations in 2007. It delineates and defines the individual and collective rights of indigenous peoples, including their property rights to cultural and ceremonial expression, identity, language, employment, health, education, etc. He agreed to answer our questions and if you want to access the full interview, the article and his complete answers are available on the Normandy Chair for Peace website.

Série de webinaires sponsorisée par la Chaire Normandie pour la Paix et la Jeunesse Mondiale pour la Justice Climatique



The Normandy Chair for Peace in collaboration with the WYCY youth movement hosted on June 28th (Europe session) and 30th (Asia-Pacific session) the first webinar of a series of webinars on the climate justice line. The objective is to refer the matter to the International Court of Justice for an advisory opinion. The theme of this first session was: Towards an advisory opinion of the International Court of Justice on the legal responsibility to ensure a stable climate for future generations.

Climate agreements (such as the Paris Agreement) and national policies are inadequate to address the climate threat because they are subject to the political power of the special interests of the fossil fuel economy. Litigation emphasizes human rights and law, and establishes legal responsibility to ensure the protection of current and future generations.

The first webinar covered the role of climate litigation, introduced the campaign for an ICJ climate case, and explored lessons learned from the ICJ's landmark advisory opinion on the legality of the threat or use of nuclear weapons. Hosted by **Alyn WARE**, 2009 Alternative Nobel Laureate, and **Rob VAN RIET**, Director of Climate & Energy at the World Future Council. This webinar was an opportunity to realize synergies between the science diplomacy work done by **Antonio OPOSA**, the Chair's team and the youth petition gathering work by WYCY. 3 more sessions are planned: in July, October and November 2021.

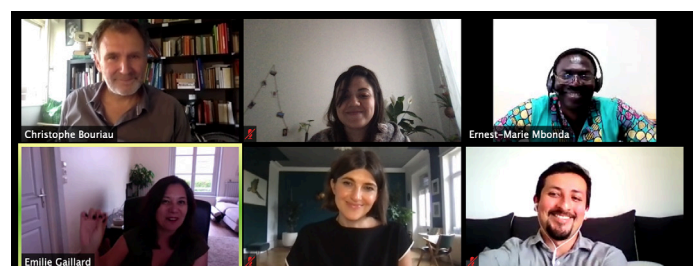

Poincaré / UL Archives, was honored to welcome **Ernest-Marie MBONDA**, Professor at the Université des Montagnes, Bangangté, Cameroon, for the third meeting of the «Study cycle - Environmental Ethics for Lawyers». In the program of this meeting, he focused his presentation on «*Intergenerational Justice: African perspectives*». Not only did he recall that Ubuntu is shared throughout sub-Saharan Africa and carries within it a principle of humanity in transgenerational relations, but he also insisted on the new dimension of ethics towards future generations. Quoting **Edouard GLISSANT** («I think in all languages»), he called for an intercultural epistemology, which echoes the work carried out by the Normandy Chair for Peace.

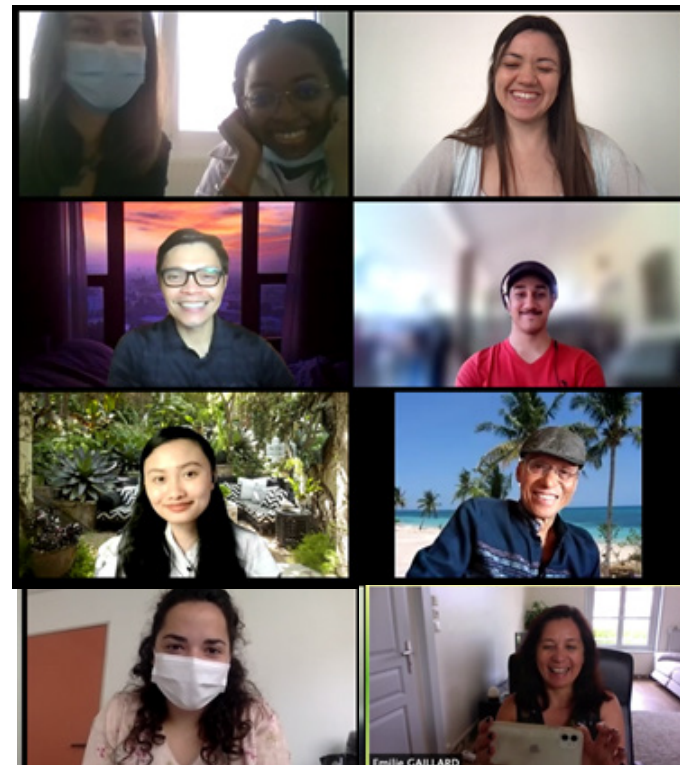
