The colloquium «Transhumanism in the era of ameliorative medicine», organized under the scientific responsibility of **A. CAYOL**, **Wang WEI** and **B. BÉVIÈRE-BOYER** in webinar on May 10 and 11, 2021, had for stake to engage multidisciplinary and international reflections on the biological and technoscientific evolutions likely to upset the human condition.

The challenge of this meeting, integrating both researchers and practitioners, is to lead discussions associating law, medicine, ethics, philosophy, sociology, anthropology and computer science in order to better understand the impact of ameliorative medicine on the human person. The participation of European and Chinese contributors allowed, by taking into account the diversity of cultures, a sharing on the future of the human being in a global dimension.

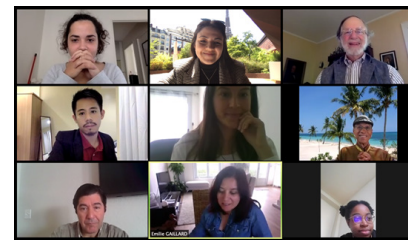

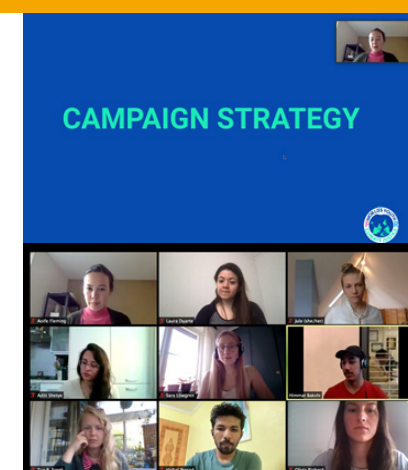


Evidence (PPE) Legal Actions for Future Generations, which seeks to use the **LAW (LAND AIR WATER)** of life to ignite the **STAR of HOPE**. A legal action that will be launched globally to preserve the evidence that is now available about the clear and present dangers of the climate crisis. So, together, we could turn these dangers of the crisis into an opportunity for real climate change.

TWO WYCJ MEMBER FORUM MEETINGS CLIMATE JUSTICE RESEARCH LINE

The Member Forums of the World Youth for Climate Justice (WYCJ) movement are meetings for members of the global movement and other youth invested in the project to refer the case to the Court of Justice for an advisory opinion on the obligations of States in climate matters. Two meetings are organized in the same day to accommodate time differences.

The meeting of May 16, 2021 focused on the elements of strategy to adopt for an effective campaign in each country/region. The members of the core group gave feedback on their work in their respective countries, gave advice and answered questions from other campaign members. The Normandy Chair of Excellence for Peace is carrying out scientific diplomacy work on this theme under the leadership of **Tony OPOSA**, the Chair's leader. She shared her progress and plans to integrate the AOICJ explanatory video in French and Spanish, which will be available on the Chair's new website.

EXCHANGE TIME AROUND THE HISTORIC DECISION OF APRIL 2021 OF THE GERMAN FEDERAL CONSTITUTIONAL COURT MAY 14TH, 2021

The Normandy Chair of Excellence for Peace organized a time of exchange on this widely hailed as historic decision by the Federal Constitutional Court, which was made public on April 29. This decision considers that the German government's climate action is insufficient, as it lacks details on emission reduction targets beyond the year 2030. It is historic because, for the first time in Europe, a constitutional court is exercising control over the fundamental duties we owe to future generations.

Since it directly echoes the work of the Chair, it was an opportunity to bring together specialists in constitutional environmental law, European environmental law, climate justice and the rights of future generations. The conference concludes with the question of how to create a new global solidarity to care for our common future.

The Normandy Chair for Peace and the Transitions Campus of Sciences Po Rennes presented the third session of the cycle of intergenerational dialogues with indigenous leaders. The objective of this cycle is to sensitize young and old to the issues and struggles of indigenous peoples by promoting exchanges with indigenous leaders.

Theme: Indigenous peoples and traditional communities: towards a sanctuary of the forests through the transmission of ancestral knowledge.



Speakers:

- Mr. **Appollinaire OUSSOU LIO**, Prince DJAKA WHAÉNU ATAWÉ of the Tolinou community of Benin, Nigeria and the Diaspora. Geographer-Naturalist, he works for the restoration of sacred forests and reforestation. Vice President of the African Biodiversity Network (ABN), member of the Executive Committee of the Alliance of Mother Nature Guardians.

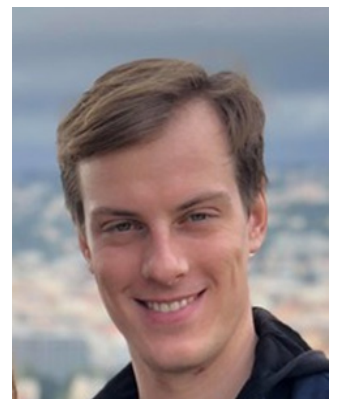

CYCLE OF MEETINGS WITH YOUNG RESEARCHERS, KEEPERS OF
PEACE WITH THE EARTH

The Normandy Chair for Peace held the 3rd meeting of the Cycle Jeunes chercheurs: gardiens de la paix avec la terre. Session with **François HULEUX**, animated by **Émilie GAILLARD**, general coordinator of the Chair.



François HULEUX, Doctor of Law, graduate of the University of Paris-Saclay (France) and Laval University (Quebec City, Canada), author of the thesis «**The contribution of the Convention for the Safeguarding of the Intangible Cultural Heritage to the conservation of biodiversity**», directed by Pr **V. GUEVREMONT** & Pr **L. NEYRET**.

In 2003, the Convention for the Safeguarding of the Intangible Cultural Heritage was adopted as a bulwark against acculturation, globalization, deforestation, etc. However, it does not guide its Parties towards the conservation and sustainable use of all the elements of biodiversity necessary for the safeguarding of ICH. At a time when species are becoming extinct and «traditional» knowledge and practices are becoming scarce, it seems essential to revise its Operational Guidelines to better safeguard the ICH associated with biodiversity. The Convention on Biological Diversity, on the other hand, allows for the management of ecosystems considered as networks of life of which humans and cultural diversity are an integral part, and serves as a basis for this proposal.

TREE CAMP - KAMPO KAHYOY (T. OPOSA)

RESEARCH LINE: THE ECONOMY THAT HEALS, PROTECTS AND RESTORES THE VITAL ORGANS OF LIFE.

*Testimony of **Felice LEONAJIOY**, young volunteer at the Normandy Peace Chair in the Philippines :*

"A sunny day in Sitio Dalig, Barangay Tua, Magallanes, Cavite, Philippines when the team travelled to see the beautiful scenery that the Kampo Kahoy offers. As you can see, the signage for our Kampo Kahoy is already built with the help of the people who have a heart for the environment.



This signage that says "Kampo Kahoy" is made out of used rope and scrap wood. This sign will also welcome you upon entering the Tree Camp.

This is the outside of the hall. This is the first thing that you will see before entering the hall. Plants are also planted in this area.



This is also a mini garden before entering the hall.

Also, let us be reminded that our tree camp signifies : culture, arts, and music of people. Paintings made by other artists and **Antonio OPOSA**, exhibited around the walls in the Tree Camp.



This is the hall where beautiful art pieces are put on display. Plants are also planted around the hall. These are the people who have a heart for preserving and caring for our tree camp.

The tree house is already built. This is a safe place to unwind because upon going up into this tree house, you can see the beautiful landscapes the area is offering. This is the view you surely would not want to miss once you go to the Tree Camp. This is also the area where the visitors of the Tree Camp may plant their trees and plants. But since it is still summer in the Philippines, the area is still dry.



This is the beautiful landscape that will welcome you upon going up in the Tree House.

Just beside the tree house, this is the main source of water which the visitors shall experience in the Tree Camp. This is what you call in the Philippines a "poso". This is a kind of well but in order for you to get water from this, you have to use the handle by moving it up and down.

Lots of various plants and trees are stored in the nursery. The plants and trees that are being taken care of this nursery are the plants and trees which the visitors may plant in the launch of the Tree Camp. In addition a dam is built near the Tree Camp. This will serve as a rainwater catchment. All the waters and rainwater are being caught by this dam so the water may be recycled and filtered in the poso.

PROJECT OF THE LYON URBAN SCHOOL "DRAWING THE LAW IN THE FACE OF THE ANTHROPOCENE"



The Normandy Chair for Peace was very honoured that **Antonio OPOSA**, the chair leader, was invited to participate in the project of the Lyon Urban School "Drawing the law in the face of the Anthropocene". An initiative coordinated by **Jérémy CHEVAL** (Ph.D, Urban architect, Ecole Urbaine de Lyon), **Lou HERRMANN** (Ph.D, Ecole Urbaine de Lyon), **Natalia KOBYLARZ** (Lawyer, Registry of the Euro-pean Court of Human Rights) and **Isabelle MICHALLET** (Associate professor in law, EVS CNRS UMR 5600 - Université Jean Moulin Lyon 3). This proposal, both visual and legal, questions how the law can respond in an original and novel way to the multiple challenges of the Anthropocene. The project echoes the «imaginative forces of law» borrowed from **Mireille DELMAS-MARTY**, who, in a series of four books, has explained how law should renew itself in the face of the major challenges of globalization. Thus, this proposal, both artistic and legal, questions the capacity of interpretation and creation of law in the face of the mutations of the planet earth system.

Likewise, this session with Mr. **OPOSA**, the precursor of environmental litigation based on intergenerational equity, explained the story and the legal aspects of his landmark case *Minors Oposa v. Secretary of the Department of Environmental and Natural Resources*, Supreme Court of the Philippines, no. 33 ILM 173 (1994), 30 July 1993 and his artistic side linked to the protection of nature, through initiatives like the "LAW of life" project. The conversation was followed by the artist, **Sophie FERNANDEZ**, an illustrator, graduated from the Estienne school in scientific illustration. At the end of this discussion, Ms **FERNANDEZ** will produce her artistic work which will represent her gaze, her understanding, her interpretation, taken from Mr. **OPOSA's** legal account. Likewise, in 2022 the Urban School of Lyon will hold an exhibition with similar stories and publish a book.
