CYCLE OF CONFERENCES - THE MAKING OF TRANSITIONAL JUSTICE IN COLOMBIA: INDIGENOUS PEOPLES, TERRITORIES AND ENVIRONMENT
RESEARCH LINE: TRANSITIONAL JUSTICE

The Colombian transitional justice system deserves academic scrutiny for its innovations and the challenges it faces in its implementation. Indeed, both the Peace Agreement and the transitional tribunal set up to integrate ethnic, territorial and environmental approaches in a context of legal pluralism are unprecedented. Thus, this series of conferences aim to promote an exchange between Colombian, French researchers and colombian indigenous people on issues related to the indigenous people rights and the environment in the Colombian Peace Agreement. It also seeks to bring the voice of indigenous/ethnic movements to be heard. **This project will begin with an inaugural conference in the months to come and will focus on highlighting the cross-cultural construction of transitional justice norms. 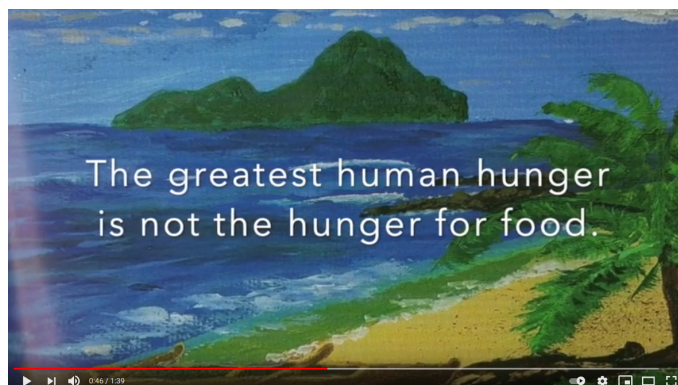

NCP SCIENTIFIC DIPLOMACY ACTION

RESEARCH LINE NUMBER 1: PROCESSES OF
MUTATION OF FUNDAMENTAL RIGHTS AND LEGAL
SYSTEMS, HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM



An action of scientific diplomacy took place after an *amicus curiae* co-authored by the CIDCE and the Normandy Chair for Peace. This was due to the initiative of Michel PRIEUR and Emilie GAILLARD, co-directors of the NCP Human Rights team. Likewise, the Normandy Chair for Peace presented its line of research on internormativity and the comparative approach in the fields of the African, European and Inter-American systems through a transgenerational approach to human rights. As well as the innovative principles brought to the international level by Professor PRIEUR, including principles such as the principle of non-regression or the need to recognize legal indicators of the effectiveness of environmental law.

A hearing was planned with the deputy Mr. Simon MOUTQUIN, in charge of the drafting of a report providing the expertise of the members of the Chair who ensures its support and its full scientific collaboration in the initiatives of the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe, which is actively considering the need to conclude either a new convention or an additional protocol to the European Convention on Human Rights, specifying that it concerns the right to a healthy environment?

MAKING PEACE WITH NATURE REPORT BY THE UNITED NATIONS ENVIRONMENT PROGRAMME

The United Nations Environment Programme - UNEP- has just published its first 2021 synthesis report entitled: *Making Peace with Nature*. A Science Plan for Addressing Climate, Biodiversity and Pollution Emergencies. The title of this report directly echoes the slogan of the Chair and its objectives since its foundation; excerpt from the preface of the UNEP : «by transforming the way we see nature, we can recognize its true value.(...) Making peace with nature is the defining task of the next decade.» (report page 4).



The report is based on evidence from global environmental assessments and is designed as a cornerstone to continue to structure the current and future scientific research activities of the Chair. *This reflected not only in the echo of the report's title with the Chair's slogan, but also with our mission : «2021 should be remembered (...) as the moment when people considered their priorities as individuals and societies and took to heart that safeguarding the health and well-being of current and future generations depends on safeguarding the health of our planet.»*.
