The Reasons for Anger: Social, Democratic and Environmental Issues for Peace (Plenary)

October 1st (9:30am - 12:45pm)

The COVID19 pandemic has added to global warming and the increase in inequalities throughout the world to create a particularly anxiety-provoking context. It has increased the feeling of mistrust towards national and international institutions and superimposed it on the feeling of declassification for a part of the population, making social links even more fragile. While health, environmental and social issues appear to be more interconnected than ever, the transition to a more sustainable and environmentally friendly economy calls into question the current model. Demonstrations of citizen anger are being expressed on all continents to demand solutions that meet the challenges. The rise of violence, identity-based tensions and extremist temptations are all threats to peace, both on a local and international scale. What answers can be formulated to make a success of our transition to a sustainable development model(s) that guarantees peace?

### **HAWAI'I CONSERVATION CONFERENCE**

On September 3, 2020, Normandy Chair for Peace member **DAVID M. FORMAN** presented at the Hawai'i Conservation Conference, the Chair and the forthcoming book Legal Actions for Future Generations (Peter Lang Publishing 2020). This book is the first volume in the Normandy Chair for Peace series, a multidisciplinary investigation of the rights of future generations and peace with the Earth. The collection strives, among other things, to ensure coherence between the various transformations underway in international, regional and national legal systems to establish sustainable protection of the environment, environmental rights and the future. Accordingly, the book fits perfectly with the theme of the conference, **OLA KA'ĀINA MOMONA**: Managing for Abundance.

In addition to introducing the book and the impressive number of contributing authors, **DAVID M. FORMAN**'s presentation began with an introductory video by co-editor Emilie Gaillard and ended with another video celebrating the recent launch of the Good stories movement by Chair leader **ANTONIO OPOSA**.

## ANIMAL SENTIENCE. LEGAL APPROACHES AND TRANSDISCIPLINARY ISSUES. (October 23 - CAEN)

Because our vision of the world is changing and because scientific knowledge is also evolving, animal sentience has become a real object of multidisciplinary research. This international symposium will bring together personalities from all horizons: ethology, biologists, philosophers, lawyers... around the central question of animal sentience. The law is not left out and must now deal with this new vision of the world: taking into account this animal sentience means extracting the non-human living being from the legal category of objects. Consequently, a mutation of the fundamental legal categories is currently at work in order to set up new legal mechanisms of protection of the animal. Peace with the Earth also means renewing and expanding our vision of the world and protecting animals in a different and better way. The Normandy Chair for Peace supports this international event and intends to relay on an international scale the imperative need to legally respect non-human living beings, starting with the consideration of animal sentience. ### I AM CLIMATE JUSTICE

CLIMATE JUSTICE: YOUTH LEAD THE WAY

An online event was organized on September 25th by World Youth for Climate Justice (WYCJ), a youth movement for climate justice.

The goal of the event is to:

- raise awareness of the reality of human rights challenges compromised by climate change
- highlight the campaign to seek an advisory opinion from the International Court of Justice, which would be a profound legal breakthrough for more concerted climate action worldwide
- launch the new global WYCJ movement.

The I am Climate Justice movement, spearheaded by Tony Oposa with the support of the Normandy Chair for Peace, has joined the World Youth for Climate Justice movement. A UNGA 75 side event was organized online.

On the occasion of this event Antonio Oposa gave his support alongside David Boyd, UN Special Rapporteur on Human Rights and the Environment and Ambassador Ralph Regenvanu of Vanuatu.

## **GOOD STORIES**

The Good Stories have been one of the Chair's main focuses since its inception. **ANTONIO OPOSA** is expanding it even further by launching the Good Stories movement in association with Professor David Boyd, United Nations Special Rapporteur on Human Rights and the Environment, and Mr. Andy Raine, member of the United Nations Legal Service for Environmental Protection.

«We are going to explore a new path and change the course of the too often negative stories and honor the success stories» says Antonio Oposa. The Chair sends letters of congratulations to those who build peace with the Earth, those who care for the Earth, the air and the water. For example, a letter was sent to the Prime Minister of Pakistan who hired tens of thousands of unemployed people to plant trees in barren mountains. On the small island of Bentayan, Indonesia, where a 50-square-meter edible garden was created, after receiving a congratulatory letter from the Chair, the plot was expanded to 20,000 square meters in less than 30 days.

From October 21st to 24th, 2020, a major international web event will feature 10 good stories per region of the world and will be broadcasted.
